The aim of this year's Conference is to explore how we can work together and by networking we can ensure children's services are safe and caring and that we will share information on our services and projects as they develop.

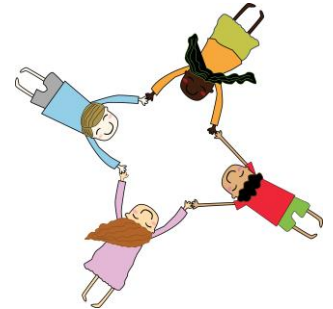
The main objectives of the Conference are to:
